## **Course Content**

This interactive course supports collaborative learning and helps students connect personal experience with global dynamics. Students explore globalisation and gain a balanced view of its influence on both global and local cultures. They examine cultural flows and their country's role within the global context. Each person shares perspectives, exchanges knowledge, and considers their country's contributions to global culture. Learning takes place through discussion, shared experiences, and reflection in a diverse classroom environment.

#### Learning outcomes

Students will be able to understand and evaluate different perspectives on globalisation and develop a balanced personal opinion on the forces shaping culture today. They will be able to identify global flows and reflect on how their own country and culture both influences and is influenced by the wider world. Students explore trends in areas such as work, media, education, and identity, and apply basic cultural theory to real-life contexts. Through shared learning and reflection, they will also strengthen their empathy and cultural awareness.
