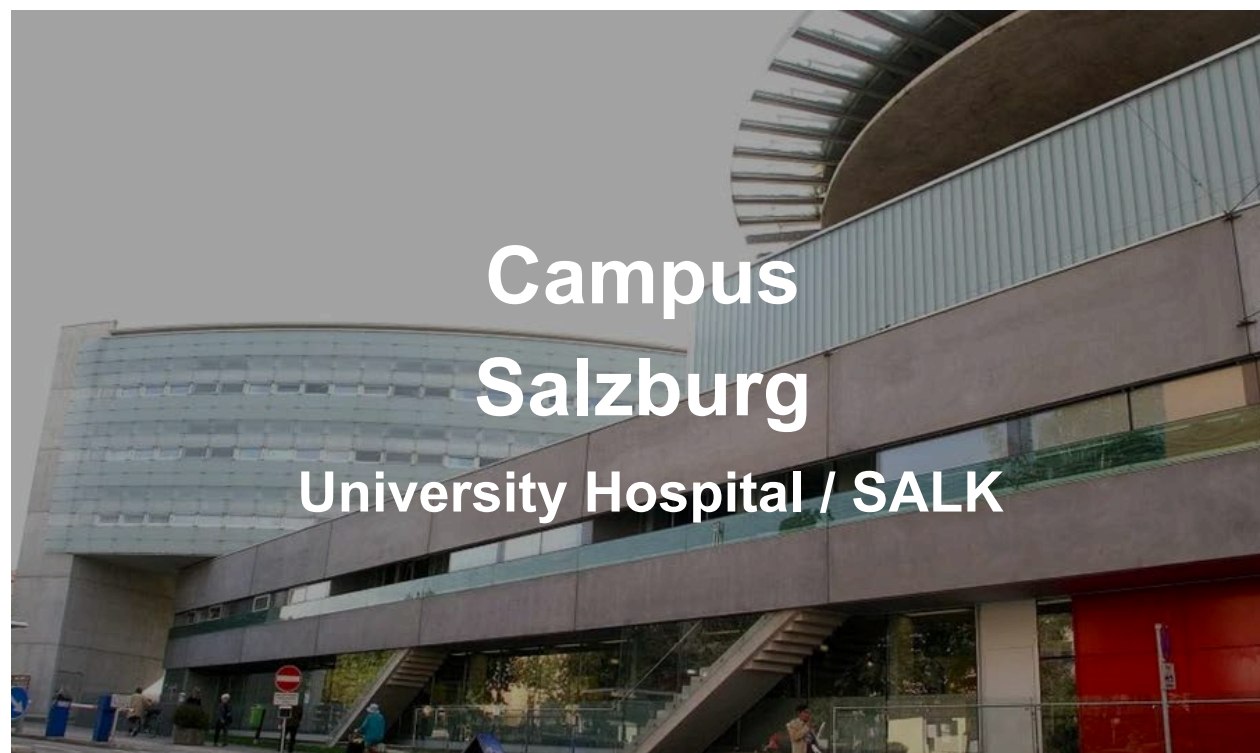
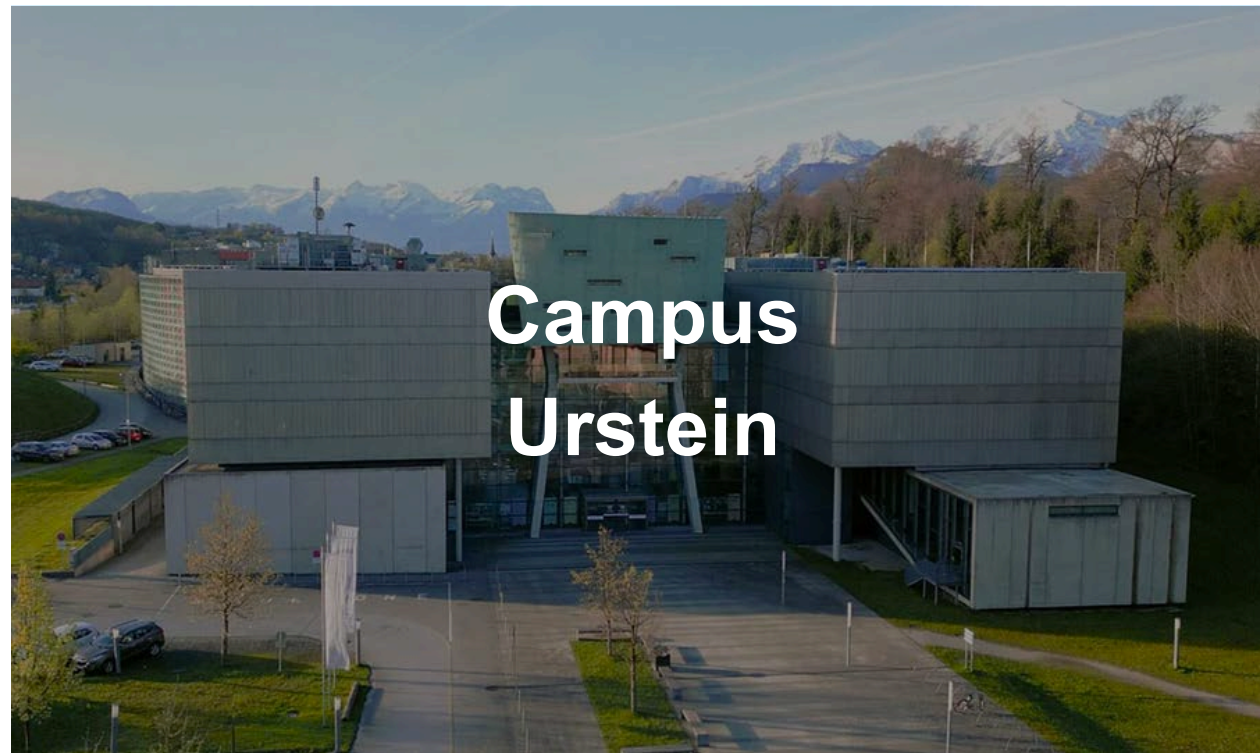

Academic Requirements

Language requirements

Students wishing to study at FH Salzburg must either have a very good command of English or German and have to provide certification or a letter of recommendation for having at least a B2 level in English and/or German in case it's not their mother tongue. A valid and internationally recognized English proficiency test such as TOEFL, IELTS or Cambridge at level B2 is recommended (B2 level in English equals a minimum of 87 points regarding TOEFL iBT and a result of at least 6.0. as to IELTS). In absence of a test, a letter of recommendation from an English instructor proving student's written and oral proficiency in English will be accepted

German Courses

German language courses are offered for free. Prior to the start of the courses, all non-German speaking incoming exchange students who want to attend a German language course will have to take part in a German placement test, which students are sent before the start of the semester. The test result will not affect their admission to FH Salzburg as an exchange student.

Incomings Application Procedure

Deadlines

AUTUMN

Nomination: 15 April
Application: 1 May

SPRING

Nomination: 15 October
Application: 1 November

Online Application Procedure

Nomination:

For a studies or internship with FH Salzburg, students need to be nominated by the international office of their partner university. They can be nominated via Mobility Online (the link will be forwarded to the partner university)

Application:

Students can only submit their applications online through Mobility Online. Once they have been nominated, FH Salzburg will send them the necessary information directly,

Application Documents

The password to fill in the online application is provided to our partner institutions who then forward it to their nominees. Following documents should be prepared:

- a letter of motivation
- a provisional Learning Agreement
- Current transcript of record
- a CV
- a Photo ID for the student card
- copy of passport
- High School Diploma/ A-levels certificate (or equivalent)
- Bachelor certificate (if applying to a Master's Program)
- valid English proficiency test/ letter of recommendation for English skills (if mother tongue is not English)

Application Procedure

Portfolio

Students who apply for **MultiMediaArt (MMA)** or **Design & Product Management (DPM)** also have to submit a portfolio. DPM students must upload a general portfolio of their work. Portfolio requirements for MultiMediaArt can be found [here](#).

Grading System

Students are evaluated on a grade from 1-5,
1 is excellent
5 is failed.
