| 1) | <p>Evidence of B2 level knowledge of German</p> <p>Most bachelor and master programmes at Salzburg University of Applied Sciences are taught in German. Applicants for English-speaking degree programmes – Innovation & Management in Tourism (bachelor and master) and Applied Image & Signal Processing (joint degree master programme with the University of Salzburg) do not need to provide evidence of their knowledge of German.</p> <p>Being able to speak German and/or English is a requirement for studying at Salzburg University of Applied Sciences.</p> <p>Evidence of the required B2 level of German knowledge according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages must be provided by no later than 31/10 of the first semester.</p> <p>The following certificates are generally recognised as evidence of sufficient knowledge of German:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • German as a subject on the high school leaving certificate or • 'B2 Mittelstufe Deutsch' or 'Wirtschaftssprache Deutsch' from the Österreichisches Sprachdiplom Deutsch or • 'TestDaF' (Test Deutsch als Fremdsprache, www.testdaf.de) with a minimum level of TDN 3 in all unit tests or • 'Zentrale Mittelstufenprüfung' and 'Kleines Deutsches Sprachdiplom' or 'Goethe-Zertifikat B2' or higher level from the Goethe Institute or • 'Zweite Stufe' of the German language diploma of the Conference of Ministers of Education of the states of the Federal Republic of Germany or • A full course in German (at least 3 years) <p>In justified individual cases, knowledge of German can be assessed by the relevant Head of Degree Programme during the admission procedure.</p> | | | | | | |
| 3) | <p>Certifications and translations (see Federal Ministry of Science, Research and Economy certification list for university studies, as of: November 2016)</p> <p>Important note: The following steps must be followed when preparing the application documents:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The original documents should be certified first of all. 2. Only AFTERWARDS should the original documents be translated by a sworn translator officially registered in the relevant country. 3. The translations should then be certified if required. <p>Foreign documents shall only have the evidential value of official Austrian documents if they have the relevant certifications (Section 293(2) ZPO [Code of Civil Procedure], as amended). Therefore in principle documents must be certified (diplomatic certification) if they are to be used in a different country. For the duration of the suspension, the documents from these countries shall be subject to free consideration of evidence. For a list of these countries, please refer to the Federal Ministry of Science, Research and Economy certification list for university studies.</p> <p>As of November 2016: Afghanistan, Burundi, Chad, Comoros, Congo, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Democratic Republic of Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Iraq, Myanmar, Somalia, South Sudan, Sudan.</p> <p>As per Section 60(3) of the Universities Act (Universitätsgesetz, UG) 2002, the rectorate of Salzburg University of Applied Sciences is entitled to waive the obligation to provide individual documents if it has been shown that it will be impossible or unreasonably difficult to present them within a reasonable period, and the documents that have been presented are sufficient to make a decision. A <u>decision on the individual case</u> will always be made <u>by the rectorate</u>.</p> <p>Translations are required if the document is not in German or English. In addition to German documents, Salzburg University of Applied Sciences also accepts English documents. Documents that are not in German or English must be translated into German or English <u>by an officially registered sworn translator</u>. <u>The original document</u> and/or certified copy/duplicate should <u>already have all the necessary certification stamps</u> so that they can be included in the translation. <u>The translation must be permanently bound to the original document and/or a certified copy thereof</u>.</p> <p>If the translation is completed by a sworn translator officially registered <u>in Austria</u>, no additional certification is required.</p> <p>Translations of foreign documents completed <u>abroad</u> must also be prepared by a sworn translator officially registered in the relevant state, and must be processed in the same way as the original foreign documents in terms of certification regulations, i.e. the form of certification of the state in which the translation was prepared shall apply.</p> | No certification or | There is an exemption from certification for documents from those countries with which Austria has concluded a bilateral certification agreement.
